




The OBSERVATORY FOR CHINA (OC), founded on December 28, 2005, it presents the newsletter with the main initiatives between January 2021 and December 2021.



Digital Macau-China Library

The Observatory for China concluded the 4th phase of the Macau-China Digital Library project, in August 2021, which already has 200 thousand free pages, which include, namely, old books, handwritten documents, cartography and periodicals published about China until the end 19th century.





III International Conference on Portugal-China Cooperation

The Observatory for China organized and participated in the III International Conference on Portugal-China Cooperation, a platform for the economy of the sea and the Atlantic gateway of the Maritime Silk Road to Eurasia, America and Africa, which took place in the UCCLA auditorium, in December 13th and 14th.

Around 30 speakers, 70 in-person participants and more than 800 online, from Portugal, China (Beijing and Macau), Brazil, Mozambique, Timor, Angola, Guinea..., European Union countries (Spain, France, Netherlands) and all continents, participated in this Conference and continue to access its full recording distributed across 3 thematic sessions, through the recording that remains on Facebook and Youtube.













Education scientific and pedagogical activities

In 2021, the Observatory continued to publicize the different language course initiatives with special emphasis on institutions with which we have agreed protocols and which have benefits for our members, namely with DLC – Distance Learning Consulting and the Study Center of Chinese Language.



Collaboration with the Autonomous University of Lisbon

The Observatory for China began regular collaboration with the Autonomous University of Lisbon, as part of its international courses on Asia and China, which are in partnership with the National Defense Institute, through the integration of an open class into its program, about the People's Republic of China.



Collaboration with University of Minho

The Observatory for China began a collaboration with the Center for Studies of the International Relations Course (CECRI), established by the Degree in International Relations at the University of Minho, in one of the panels of the second edition of the Winter Crash Course, with China as the object of study. The President and Vice-President António dos Santos Queirós contributed to two conferences, which were recorded, and continue to make their way in the digital space.




Editions and publications

Conference on the 100th anniversary of the Chinese Communist Party.

In 2021, the Observatory for China began pre-editing the communications presented to the Conference on the 100 years of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), as well as the texts of the 3rd Portugal-China cooperation conference, which we will publish in 2 books.

Following an international competition from the Confucius Institute, the Universidad de León, Spain and Tianjin Normal University, China, published the book by the vice-president of the Observatory, António dos Santos Queirós, "Understanding the Chinese Way into a New Era, Ecological Socialism and Eco civilization", in the field of Political Philosophy.





International relations and institutional development

In 2021, the Observatory for China deepened its collaboration with the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS), namely in participating in conferences and carrying out mutual initiatives, highlighting the invitation from the Institute of European Studies (CASS), to participate in the conference on "Green New Silk Road and Europe-China (China-Portugal) cooperation under World Great Changes", took place on May 25th



The Observatory for China was invited by the Chongyang Institute for Financial Studies, Renmin University of China to talk about the impact of the COVID 19 pandemic and anti-China rhetoric, in Beijing. on August 9, 2021.



Routes to the East

The Observatory for China collaborated with the "Rotas a Oriente" (Routes to the East) project of the Confucius Institute of the University of Aveiro, which allowed the collaboration to be extended to the University of Dalian.

The Observatory organized the event in partnership with the Association for the Promotion of Peace for One China, Oriental Thought Chinese Culture Association, Commercial and Industrial Association of Chinese in Portugal, Association for Cooperation and Development of Chinese in Portugal, Portugal -Great Bay Cooperation Association, Portugal-China Chamber of Cooperation and Development, International Research Center, ICODEPO-Institute for Portugal-Orient Cooperation and Development, League of Chinese in Portugal. It took place in Condeixa on the 18th and 21st of June.
